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SPEECH LANGUAGE PATHOLOGIST ASSISTANT

GOALS

- To provide speech therapy services under the guidance of the Speech Pathologist for students from birth to age 22 identified under state and federal regulation.

QUALIFICATIONS

- completion of an AA degree in Speech-Language Pathology Assistants or completion of a baccalaureate degree in Speech-Language Pathology or Communication Science Disorders; and eligible to obtain a license from the Board of Examiners Speech-Language Pathologists as a Speech-Language Pathology Assistant
- paid professional experience preferred
- valid driver's license

PERSONAL QUALITIES

- high level of ethical behavior and confidentiality
- interact with the public tactfully and courteously
- work cooperatively with ESD employees and staff of local school districts

PROFESSIONAL QUALITIES

- demonstrates willingness to learn and implement instructional methods, strategies and techniques necessary to assist students with communication disabilities
- demonstrates the ability to exercise patience, courtesy, tact and good judgment requiring both physical and mental capacities for dealing with students with special needs and challenging behavior
- demonstrates the ability to establish effective and cooperative relations with professional and support staff
- demonstrates the ability to follow assignments independently
- demonstrates competency in oral and written communication skills
- demonstrates competency with the use of high and low technology

RESPONSIBILITIES

- provide audiological, speech and language services to identified students according to federal and Oregon laws and regulations including therapy and documentation of student progress
- maintain records and appropriate documentation of student performance and progress toward individual goals
- conduct pre-screenings of students at-large according to ESD policy and practice
- participate actively in Individual Education Plan (IEP) teams and/or Individual Family Service Plan (IFSP) teams considering special student needs under the direction of the SLP
- maintain professional skills including knowledge of emerging ideas and approaches
- communicate effectively with supervising SLP regarding service delivery concerns about students, parents, and teachers
- assist with clerical duties, preparation of materials and activities, DMAP billings, and reports
- other duties as assigned

SALARY AND WORK YEAR

- placed on classified salary schedule
- 150 day work year
- Public Employees Retirement System employer portion paid by district, with a deduction for the employee portion
